JUDGE EDWARD RODGERS CHAMPION OF FREEDOM AWARD

The Palm Beach County Bar Association's Committee for Diversity and Inclusion will present the **Judge Edward Rodgers Champion of Freedom Award** at the annual Bench Bar Conference. The recipient should be a Palm Beach County Bar Association member or an organization which:

- 1. Consistently exhibits a spirit of commitment to fairness in the development, recruitment, retention, and promotion of all people who are members of, or who are seeking to enter, the legal profession.
- 2. Cultivates and promotes initiatives to preserve **freedom and opportunity** for all within the legal community.
- 3. Defends and promotes freedom to facilitate education, community outreach, and social engagement with and between people of all ethnic or religious backgrounds, gender, socioeconomic status, sexual orientation, and/or physical and mental capabilities so that all individuals can enter and prosper in the legal field.
- 4. Exhibits brave, courageous, visionary and/or insightful leadership to confront and oppose discrimination, exclusion, and inequity, and to resolve injustices through strategic collaboration, sharing of resources and ideas, and establishment of priorities that enhance **freedom and opportunity for all.**
- 5. Actively pursues goals, action steps, and initiatives to ensure **freedom** and fair access to opportunity at all levels of the legal profession and community at large.
- 6. Is passionate about advancing equal **access to, and knowledge of,** the legal system and a free and fair Constitutional democracy.
- 7. Has implemented and demonstrated best practices that support **freedom and opportunity** within the legal community.
- *Individual Members of the Board of Directors and the Committee for Diversity & Inclusion are ineligible for this award.
- *Although the committee acknowledges, supports, and appreciates the work of organizations whose main objective is to promote diversity, such organizations are ineligible for this award.
- *The person and/or organization must be in Palm Beach County, and the criteria above must have been achieved in Palm Beach County.
